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#### **NARRATIVE**

WMATA's Compact Law - Title III, as amended (Public Law 94-306) provides legal authority for the creation and jurisdiction of the Metro Transit Police. It stipulates that WMATA's Metro Transit Police personnel shall receive police training at least equal to the training requirements of each signatory within the Transit Zone. With the approval and execution of this procurement, the Authority will meet the Virginia mandates required for all full-time and sworn officer personnel as well as a significant portion of the requirements of the District of Columbia and Maryland. The remainder of mandated training for the District of Columbia and Maryland is conducted by the Metro Transit Police Academy.

On February 12, 1998, the Board of Directors authorized the General Manager/CEO to execute an agreement establishing WMATA membership with the Northern Virginia Criminal Justice Academy, the Board stipulated that the Authority share of the Academy's costs shall not exceed 16% of the operating expenses, nor 16% of the allocated debt service, and that the Federal Transit Administration had given its consent to the agreement (Resolution #98-04). In FY98 the Authority's share of the Academy's cost was 14.59%, which was derived by dividing the number of sworn Metro Transit Police positions (286) by the total number of sworn positions in 17 participating agencies of the Academy (1,959.8). In FY06, one agency withdrew from the Academy, thereby increasing the 16 remaining agencies' shares of the operating cost and debt service.

In FY07 the 16 member agencies` have, in aggregate, 2,457 sworn positions. The number of sworn Metro Transit Police positions is 400; consequently, the MTPD`s share of FY07 NVCJA cost is16.28%.
