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NARRATIVE

The Metro Transit Police Department (MTPD) currently has an aging CAD system with obsolete software. They currently uses the Authority's mainframe computer system for Record Management System (RMS) functions. This mainframe system has been in use since 1983. The Authority has standardized on using Commercial Off The Shelf (COTS) solutions. The standardization and replacement of the Mainframe necessitates the acquisition of new CAD/RMS commercial software packages. The COTS solution is an integrated approach that includes Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD), Field Reporting, Case Management, Crime Analysis Tools, and Information Sharing among other regional police departments and Federal Agencies, and other functions related to police department. With a new and modern RMS and its related components, the Authority will be implementing software that is on the leading edge in public safety software. We request program level approval to spend up to \$700,000 to acquire and implement this COTS solution.
