	National Explosives Detection K-9 Team Program; Ratify Agreement; Increase Pending FY07 Oper Budget			
PURPOSE:	To request Board endorsement and support of the Metro Transit Police Canine Unit for Rail Explosives Detection by granting approval: (1) to ratify a five-year, \$602,500 (\$120,500 per year) non-matching Cooperative Agreement with the U.S. Transportation Security Administration (2) to increase the proposed MTPD Fiscal 2007 Operating Budget by \$120,500 to pay for TSA reimbursable costs accruable in FY07.

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NARRATIVE

The Metro Transit Police K-9 Unit has 14 Explosives Detection Canine Teams (1 police officer + 1 canine = a "team") to sweep rail stations, buses and other WMATA facilities as a proactive search for harmful substances or explosives. K-9 Teams also respond to service calls, such as suspicious packages and bomb threats—which can cause service disruptions and impose unacceptable risk to the traveling public, and which need to be resolved quickly. Explosive detection canine teams are a proven reliable resource for detecting explosives, and they are a key component in a balanced counter-terrorism program. MTPD K-9 teams perform explosive detection duties in addition to regular patrol assignments.

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security/Transportation Security Administration (TSA) operates the National Explosives Detection Canine Program to help law enforcement agencies acquire canines, train canine teams, procure canine materials and supplies, and reimburse agencies for TSA-approved, unbudgeted canine handler personnel expenses.

TSA uses a "Cooperative Agreement" instrument to offer agencies those services, equipment, materials and labor reimbursements. Two MTPD officers and their dogs just completed a 10-week TSA training session, which the new agreement made possible. All training costs, including transportation and lodging were borne by TSA.

The Cooperative Agreement requires no matching funds, is revenue neutral, and has no affect on Subsidy.

The TSA "Cooperative Agreement" prohibits TSA funds from supplanting (replacing) WMATA funding already allocated for MTPD''s three canine teams.

Pursuant to Board Resolution 2002-22, which authorized the Chief of Staff to apply for non-matching federal and state grants, WMATA signed a Cooperative Agreement with the U.S. Transportation Security Administration, in the Department of Homeland Security, on February 8, 2006. If approved, this action will ratify the TSA Cooperative Agreement.

RECOMMENDATION:

The WMATA Board of Directors (1) ratify a five-year, \$602,500 (\$120,500 per year) non-matching Cooperative Agreement (No. HSTS02-06-H-MLS111) with the U.S. Transportation Security Administration, and (2) increase the proposed MTPD Fiscal 2007 Operating Budget and FY08 through FY11 Operating Budgets by \$120,500 each to pay for TSA reimbursable costs accruable in each of those years.
