#### **NARRATIVE**

The Greenbelt Yard Rail Car maintenance building contains lifts used to raise rail cars off the floor for the performance of certain maintenance/repair activities. A few months ago a lift failed while moving a rail car into the full up position. The investigation revealed a failure of a component of the lift called a jack screw. Although the failure of the lift did not pose a safety risk to shop personnel, the remainder of the lifts were taken out of service as a safety precaution.

To mitigate the problems associated with the lifts being taken out of service, portable lifts have been procured to allow for the resumption of some but not all of the maintenance functions at Greenbelt.

WMATA sought help from a metallurgical consultant to assist with the analysis of the failure. This effort revealed deficiencies in 159 of 162 jack screws. As a result, all jack screws at Greenbelt Yard are in need of replacement. This effort includes the disassembly and removal of the old jack screw, reassembly incorporating new jack screws, alignment, functional testing, load testing and certification.

Currently Greenbelt Yard is undergoing an expansion and renovation as part of the Metro Matters Yard Program. The contract that includes Greenbelt Yard involves work in the car maintenance building where the failed lifts are located. Therefore, staff recommends modifying this contract to facilitate the expeditious repair of the lifts.

WMATA's order of magnitude estimate for the cost of the repairs is \$2,500,000 for the repairs plus any other problems that may be identified when the lifts are disassembled.

A sole source justification has been prepared under a Determinations and Findings report for this action.
