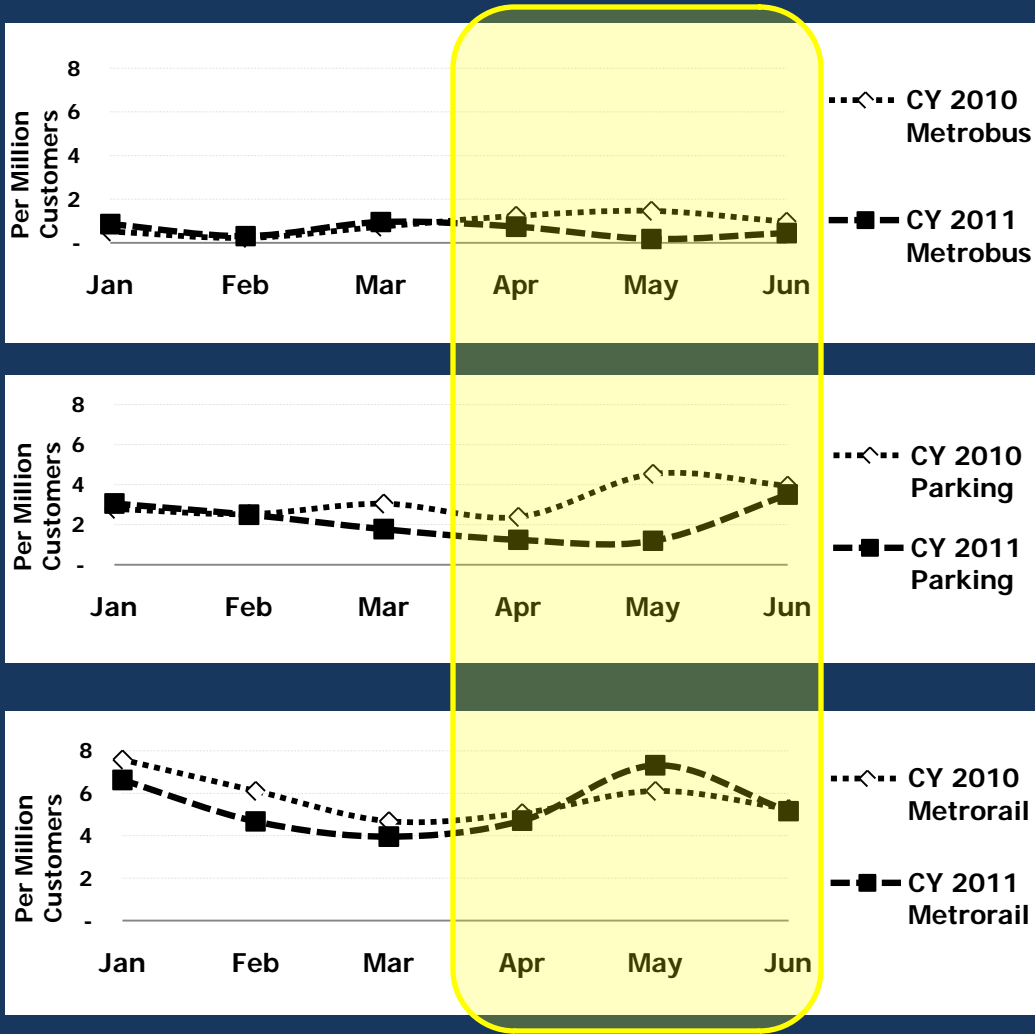
MTPD Significant Facts

Second Quarter April 1 – June 30, 2011

- Received 16,427 calls for service
- 355 Arrests
- 1,931 criminal/civil citations for fare evasion and public conduct violations
- 11 bus operator assaults
- The probability of being a victim of a Part I Crime in the Metrorail system is 5.75 per million riders for 2011 2nd Quarter

Actions

- Realigned police deployments to maximize visibility in the system
- Adjusted patrol locations to reflect where youth gather in the summer
- Continued meeting with bus operators to inform bus security strategies and reduce assaults

Actions

- Utilized sky towers to monitor stations with large surface parking lots
- Officers from local jurisdictions lent support by patrolling parking lots and garages
- Removed abandoned bicycles to discourage further thefts



2011 Second Quarter Significant Arrests

- Three arrests were made in early 2010 involving robberies of Apple handheld devices (i.e., iPhones, iPads)
- Fencing operation at retail booths at the Pentagon City and Potomac Mills Shopping Malls
- Partnered with Arlington County Police Department and the FBI
- Investigation, lasting several months, involved two “Buy Bust” operations
- Indictments on July 28, 2011





MTPD Future Initiatives

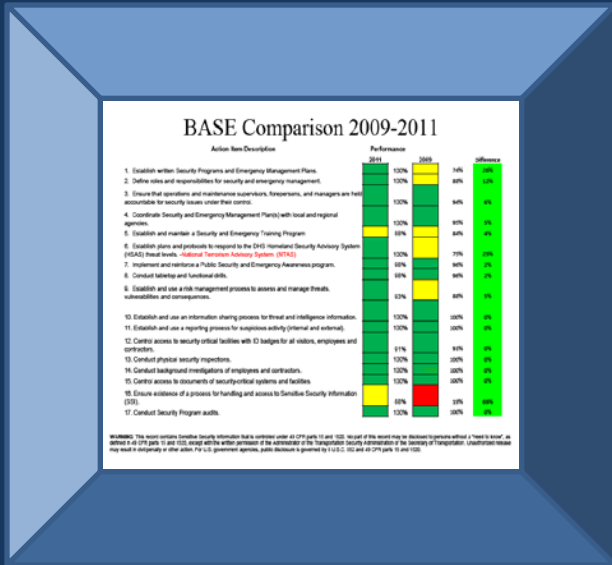
- Increase security at bicycle racks

- Meet monthly with BUS to gather intelligence and identify strategies to reduce assaults
