TITLE:

Amend FY2013 Reimbursable Operating Budget - FY2012 Security Grant

PURPOSE:

PRESENTATION SUMMARY

Metro Transit Police have applied for, and received, Transit Security Grant Program (TSGP) funding to sustain specialized security efforts and to initiate and award multiple contracts for projects provided by TSGP funding. This funding requires an amendment to the Metro's FY2013 operating reimbursable budget.

The Finance and Administration Committee is informed about the application for FY2012 Transit Security Grant Program funding for various security enhancements for the Metro Transit Police Department (MTPD). The committee ratifies the acceptance and approves to amend the FY2013 Reimbursable Operating Budget to include \$1.536 million from the TSGP.

DESCRIPTION:

Metro's funding request to sustain the specialized security teams with federal funds was successful.

Key Highlights

- Funding received from Transit Security Grant Program assists in securing and protecting the Metro system against terrorism.
- The addition to the operating reimbursable budget provides the resources to protect Metro's assets and customers.
- Security enhancements prevent loss of assets and disruptions in service that may be caused by a terrorist attack.

Background and History

Prior to this request, MTPD has funded sworn officer positions specific to anti-terrorism from the Federal FY2007 TSGP, FY2009 TSGP, and FY2009 ARRA/TSGP (Law Enforcement). Typically, these funds have supported a dedicated bomb response liaison, additional explosives canine teams, and the Anti-Terrorism Teams. Funding

for each of these efforts was set to expire in calendar year 2012. This award will continue to fund these efforts through September 30, 2014.

Discussion

The TSGP is a competitive grant program available to the nation’s transit at highest risk. This award was not made to Metro as a result of a specific threat. The entire \$7.7 million has been awarded and will continue critical operational activities to be performed by sworn officers within MTPD into Metro’s FY2015. These funds must be used to support the MTPD for specific tasks to be performed by sworn officers under the grant. Metro has been awarded other grants for infrastructure security improvements.

WHEREAS, The United States Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has identified the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) as a national critical infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, The DHS has created grant programs to protect assets and customers from acts of terrorism; and

WHEREAS, The DHS has awarded WMATA grant funds totaling \$7.775 million to fund eligible activities during the period of FY2012 to FY2015; and

WHEREAS, The aforementioned DHS grants are funded entirely from federal grant proceeds with no local matching funds required; and

WHEREAS, WMATA has submitted a grant application for and has been selected for a \$7.775 million DHS grant; and

WHEREAS, WMATA has identified \$1.536 million in eligible early action items to be funded in FY2013 by the DHS grant; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Directors ratifies the application and acceptance of DHS grant funds under the Transportation Security Grant Program to protect assets and customers from acts of terrorism; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Board of Directors increases the FY2013 Reimbursable Operating Budget by \$1.536 million from \$35.157 million to \$36.693 million; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Board of Directors authorizes the General Manager and Chief Executive Officer to initiate and award contract actions or agreements necessary to implement these funds; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the actions hereby authorized are subject to the receipt and availability of the federal funds; and be it finally
