WHEREAS, At the June 2, 2005 Planning and Development (P&D) Committee Meeting, WMATA staff proposed a Public/Private Technology Partnership Program to achieve the following goals:

- Improve customer service and system reliability
- Generate new streams of revenue for WMATA; and

WHEREAS, Staff presented proof that there was active interest in Public-Private Technology Partnerships from the Federal, State and local levels of government and the private sector; and

WHEREAS, Staff identified four examples where technology partnerships might be applicable; and

WHEREAS, Staff presented a work plan that identified a number of early actions that included surveying the market through the issuance of a Request for Information (RFI) and conducting a Technology Summit; and

WHEREAS, The P&D Committee passed a resolution directing staff to issue the RFI, coordinate with the American Public Transportations Association, hold meetings with area technology councils and report back to the Committee; and

WHEREAS, In accordance with the P&D Committee's direction, on November 3, 2005 staff reported to the Committee the results of its research effort including examples of successful technology partnerships, industry interest and supporting Federal legislation; a primary area for pilot testing an Integrated Customer Communications System and a schedule of deliverables resulting from a competitive procurement process; and

WHEREAS, The Procurement Policy of WMATA calls for the approval of the Board to initiate a full and open competitive procurement process involving issuance of an RFI and a Reguest for Proposal (RFP); and

WHEREAS, The proposed competitive selection process for the Technology Partnership Program will include issuance of a RFI, screening of initial proposals based on qualifications and issuance of a RFP to a pre-qualified list of potential partners; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Directors approve initiation of a competitive procurement process to solicit industry interest in one or more technology partnerships, to qualify a number of bidders that will develop and submit detailed proposals in response to a RFP, to establish the best value among the bidders responding to the RFP, and return to the Board for award of the contract; and be it finally

RESOLVED, That this Resolution shall be effective immediately.
