The Executive Committee's acceptance of OIG's report entitled: The Inspector General's Semiannual Report to the Board of Directors, No. 33

The Inspector General's Semiannual Report to the Board of Directors, No. 33 summarizes the activities and accomplishments of the Office of Inspector General (OIG) during the six-month period ending December 31, 2023.

Acceptance of the final report constitutes the Board's authorization to post it on the WMATA OIG website provided the Inspector General has conferred with the General Counsel and confirmed that any private or confidential information has been redacted in accordance with applicable law and WMATA policy.

Background:

Board Resolution 2006-18 requires the Inspector General to make a report periodically to a committee of the Board designated by the Board as the committee may require, and semi-annually to the Board of Directors.

Discussion:

During this reporting period, OIG's Office of Audits & Evaluations focused on WMATA's major operational and financial challenges, issuing 11 contract audits, three Buy America audits, four audit reports, and one evaluation report. OIG audit work led to \$11.1 million in total possible savings identified through audits and evaluations. Based on an annual budget of \$12.4 million, over the six-month period, OIG returned \$1.8 dollars to WMATA for every dollar spent.

Investigative work by the Office of Investigations resulted in four Reports of Investigation, one Management Assistance Report, and the indictment of a WMATA employee responsible for the sale of surplus goods.

The work highlighted in this report demonstrates OIG's commitment to promoting accountability, efficiency, and effectiveness in WMATA's programs and operations and keeping the Board of Directors fully and currently informed about deficiencies in WMATA's activities, as well as the necessity for and progress of corrective actions.
