Benefits of Automatic Train Operations (ATO)

Safety Efficiency Reliability

- ATO mitigates the significant hazard of red signal overruns
- 0 red signal overruns on Red Line since December 15 activation of ATO
 - Green Yellow rollout was on May 23, 2025
- 3 red signal overruns on lines running in manual since December 15

- ATO reduces resources required to deliver the same amount of service
- Run two less trains in June on the Red Line without decreasing service
- Save ~\$7 Million in operating expenses in FY26 if operating in ATO at design speed on all lines

- Service for customers: Endto-end run time reduced from 70 to 66 minutes on the Red Line
 - Further being reduced to 62 minutes on June 22nd



ATO Performance on the Red Line

- Returned to ATO on the Red Line on December 15, 2024
- Customer Ontime Performance increased
 2% in March with the Red Line in ATO
- Schedule adherence has improved
- Trains stopped at the 8-car marker 99.98% through June 3rd over1,158,288 ATO stops
- Platform overruns have dropped 70% from initial rollout



ATO Lessons Learned from Red Line

- ✓ December 31, 2024: ATO Stop Memo
- ✓ January 6, 2025: Formalized cross-functional working group to help reduce overruns
- ✓ January 10, 2025: Returned to Normal Operations Guidance
- ✓ February 7, 2025: SOP 40 Modification (Clarification on ATO Stop Usage)
- ✓ March 7, 2025: Ride alongs initiated for operators
- ✓ April 25, 2025: All safety certification documents provided to WMSC for Blue-Orange-Silver lines
- ✓ May 2-8, 2025: Cancel Station Stop Deactivation Completed for Legacy railcars




ATO Performance on the Green/Yellow Lines

- Returned to ATO on the Green and Yellow Lines on May 23, 2025
- Trains stopped at the 8-car marker 99.97% through June 3, through 97138 ATO stops

- ✓ March 31, 2025: Yellow Line Temporary Use Notice issued to WMSC
- ✓ April 25, 2025: Issue Blue/Orange/Silver Temporary Use Notice to WMSC
- ✓ May 23, 2025: Green/Yellow Lines go live with ATO
- □June 15, 2025: Blue/Orange/Silver Lines go live with ATO (anticipated)
