I want to thank you and the members of the Investigations Review Panel for your continued support of the Metro Transit Police Department (MTPD). The department appreciates your feedback regarding this quarter's review and will continue to strengthen our community engagement. The following are a broad range of MTPD activities and programs that help build community trust and improve community relations:

- In 2022, MTPD sworn officers will be issued Active Bystander for Law Enforcement (ABLE) refresher through In-service training.
- In 2022, through MIR, all sworn officers will be provided with Mental Health First-Aid training which will be provide tools for interacting with persons in crisis.
- MTPD's Homeless Outreach Team continues to engage our non-destination riders through outreach partnerships with charitable organizations where food and clothing are provided to those in need.
- MTPD's Community Services Bureau (CSB) is in the process of retaining mental health professionals to respond to mental health crisis.
- MTPD's CSB has initiated a Youth Programs Initiative where MTPD members will provide training in the arts, sports/health, mentorship, education, and college/career readiness to the region's youth.

MTPD continues to build and maintain community trust through ethical decision making and transparency.
