3	Bid Bond – Section 14 note C (page 12) states that the bid guarantee shall be returned to the successful bidder as soon as practicable, after it furnishes all required documents and executes the Contract. Does this mean the entire 530 period after the last shipment of steps is received and approved by WMATA? As we have never been required to have a Bid Guarantee on any projects we have done, I'm uncertain as to the mechanics of this bid guarantee.	The bid guarantee will be returned to the successful bidder after the award.	
4	Availability of Funds for the Next Fiscal Year — Chapter 1 Terms and Conditions, Section 9 (page 35) states that basically WMATA cannot guarantee that funds are available for this project beyond the current fiscal year. Since this contract appears to overlap fiscal years, how can we be guaranteed that we will be compensated? In order to execute this contract, there will be a tremendous amount of capital, both financial and intellectual, that will be expended on our end. We cannot make these expenditures unless we know for certain that we will be paid in a timely manner.	This is standard Boiler Plate language that we include in our solicitation to inform the contractor that funding is only available for the current year only. However, the language that you referenced should not be interpreted that funds will not be available for the subsequent fiscal year(s).	
5	DBE Goal 3% - I have researched lowa based registered DBE's and have not found any companies supplying products or services that would be helpful for this project. Does this mean we can request a DBE waiver before quoting?	You can use DBE for things such and delivery and transportation; however, they must be certified by WMATA, DC DOT or MWCUP before they can be awarded a contract. For information regarding waiver, see Appendix B, Section 6 (c), Pg. 120-121.

In order to meet the APTA requirement of 320 lbs. with 5 times factor of safety, the weight can be increased. There was a single die casting Uni step (Westinghouse) made by Schindler which met that criteria. With the project in similar lines with that of Fujitec, this will meet that load requirement
