Overall Ridership in January

■ Federal Government closure in 2019 skews comparisons this month

- Winter weather impacted ridership January 12-14, 2019
- Use caution when interpreting data this month
- Comparing January 2020 to a comparable time in December 2018, ridership *might have been*:
 - Approximately stable or up on rail
 - Down about 5% on bus

■ Rail

- Substantially higher than last year, propelled by Federal Government closure in 2019
- Weekends 19-35% higher than last year

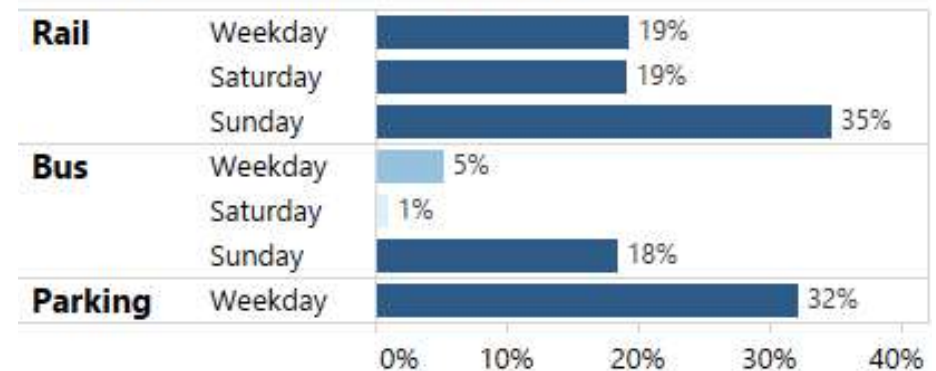
■ Bus

- 5% above last year on weekdays, 1-18% above on weekends

■ Parking

- 32% above last year, by double digits at most stations

January 2020 Change in Ridership

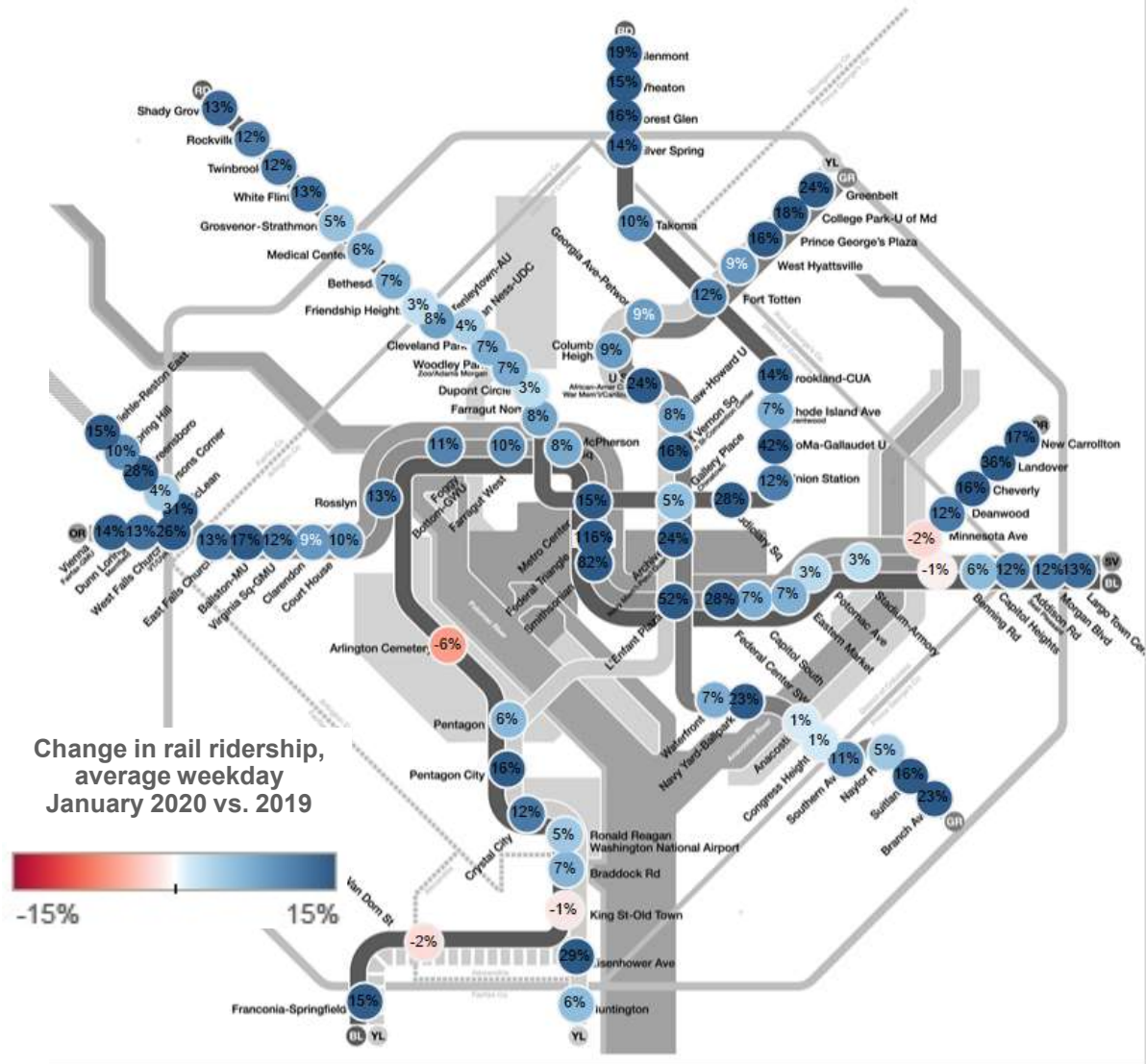

Metrorail Ridership

- **Weekdays 19% higher than last year**
 - Ridership above 2019 level at nearly all stations
 - Particular apparent change at stations with high ridership from federal workers, e.g.: Federal Triangle, NoMa, Smithsonian
- **Similar difference from last year on weekends**
 - Saturdays +19%, Sundays +35%
 - Likely impacted by closure of federal attractions in 2019, e.g. the Smithsonian museums
- **Notes:**
 - Winter weather impacted ridership January 12-14, 2019



Metrobus Ridership

▪ Weekday bus ridership 5% higher than last year

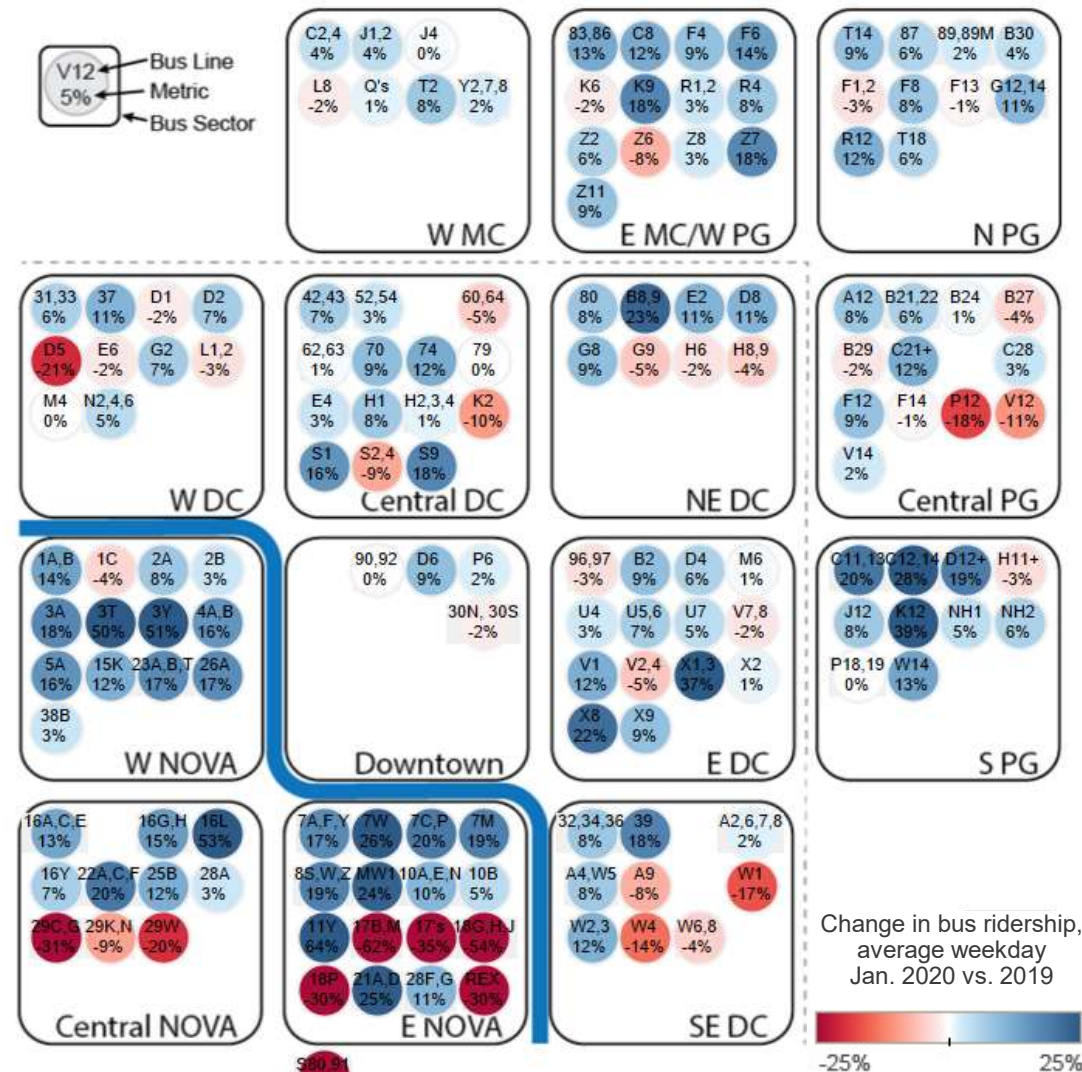
- Apparent growth compared to federal government closure in 2019
- Biggest gains on bus lines with higher ridership from federal workers

▪ Weekends 1-18% higher than 2019

- Sunday change of 18% inflated by one snow day in 2019

▪ Notes:

- Work stoppage at Cinder Bed Road division impacted most of January ridership; ended late January. Routes affected in Virginia: 17B,G,H,K,L,M; 18G,H,J,P; 29C,G,K,N,W; REX, S80,91
- Winter weather impacted ridership January 12-14, 2019
- Farebox data issues on the D5



Metro Parking Utilization

■ Overall utilization 78%

- Compares favorably to 57% last year (Federal Government closure in 2019)

■ Parking 32% higher than last year

■ Notes:

- Stability at Minnesota Avenue the result of little change in 2019 - suggests little usage there from federal workers
- Winter weather impacted usage on Monday, January 14, 2019
