Note: Percentage changes in this document represent year-over-year changes in ridership, compared to the same time, location, and day type **one year ago** unless noted as 'pre-pandemic' which then represents a comparison to five years ago. Bus ridership shown here is from Metro's automatic passenger counters (APCs), in both current and baseline months. Beginning October 2023, Metro shifted the method for processing APC data that is shown in this report. All historical data was reprocessed, and reports going back to July 2023 have been restated with the updated data. For Metrorail ridership prior to January 2023, Metro reported only tap ridership, which understated the total number of riders. The completion of the installation of new faregates in January 2023 enabled Metro to report total (tap and non-tap) ridership. As of January 2024, year-over-year and pre-pandemic comparisons on rail are made with total ridership. Prior to January 2024, these comparisons were made using tap-only ridership. Parking utilization is from the farebox system.

Overall Ridership in November

Total Ridership

- Compared to November 2023, ridership increased by 5% overall, 6% on weekdays, 3% on Saturdays, and 15% on Sundays.

Rail

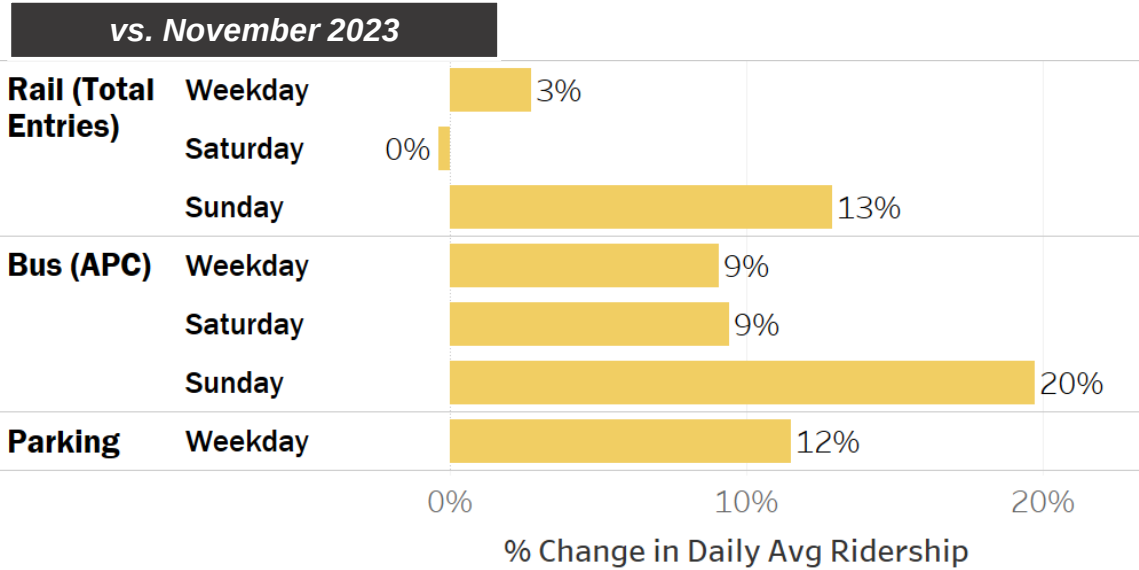
- Compared to November 2023, ridership increased by 1% overall, 3% on weekdays, 0% on Saturdays, and 13% on Sundays.

Bus

- Ridership has increased 8% overall, 9% on weekdays, 9% on Saturdays, and 20% on Sundays compared to November 2023.

Parking

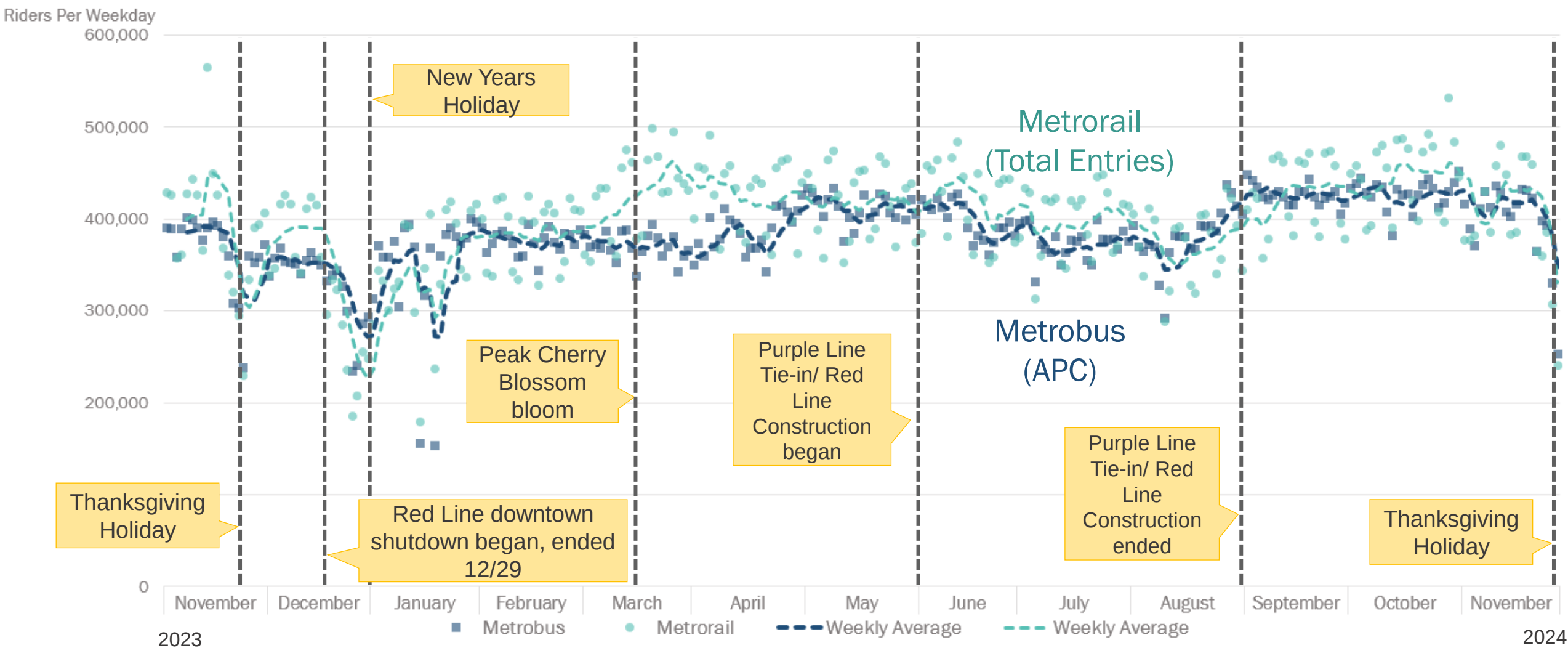
- Usage has increased by 12% compared to November 2023.

Ridership Trends Over the Past Year

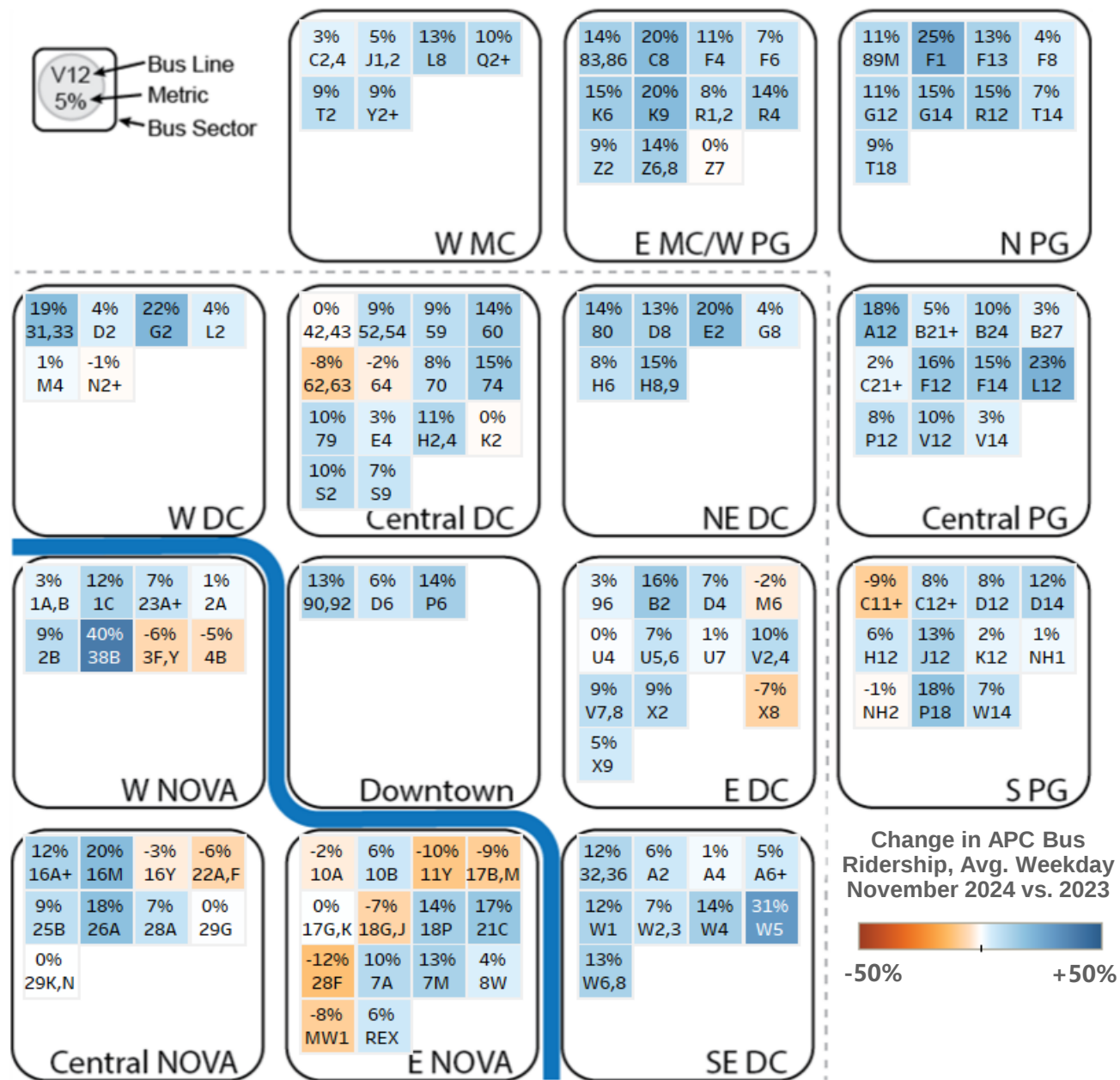

Metrobus Ridership

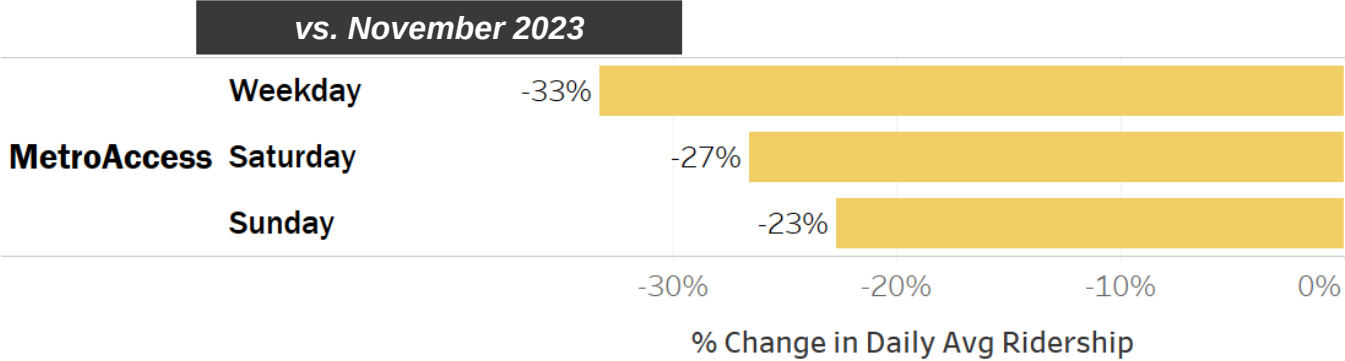
- Metrobus ridership has increased 8% overall, 9% on weekdays, 9% on Saturdays, and 20% on Sundays compared to November 2023.
- About 3% of stop events were above crowding thresholds with more crowding on weekdays.
- There were approximately 37,000 total shuttle rides made in November 2024, serving customers on:
 - Orange Line between Stadium-Armory and New Carrollton on the weekend of 11/2 – 11/3
 - Red Line between Medical Center and Grosvenor-Strathmore on the weekend of 11/9 – 11/11 and between Fort Totten and NoMa on the weekend of 11/16 – 11/17.

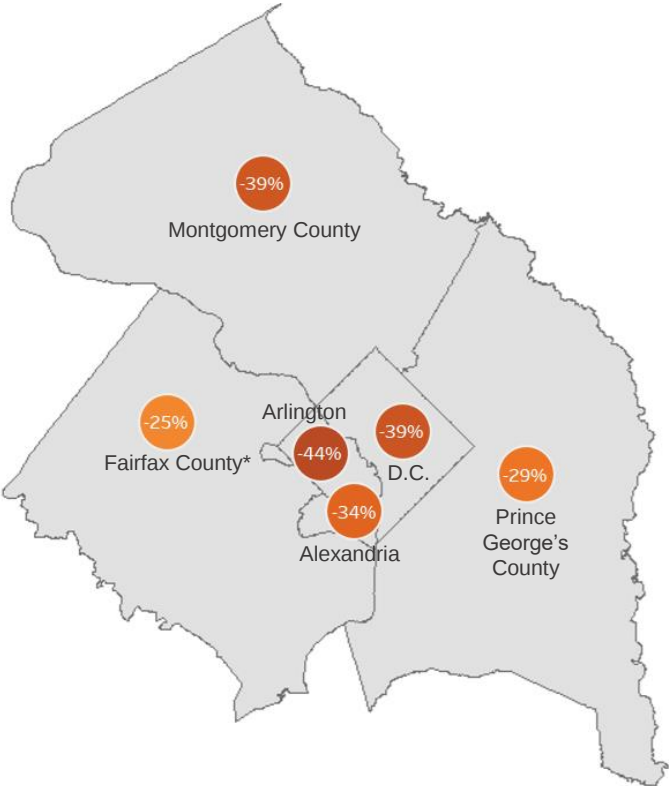
MetroAccess Ridership

- In November 2024, MetroAccess provided on average 3,200 paratransit rides on weekdays, 1,500 on Saturdays, and 1,300 on Sundays.
- Ridership is down 33% on weekdays, 27% on Saturdays, and 23% on Sundays compared to November 2023.
- Notes:
 - This slide shows only rides made via our paratransit service. Trips provided through our Abilities-Ride program are not reflected in these numbers. Metro Access-eligible customers' rail and bus rides are counted in overall rail and bus ridership.

*Fairfax City and Falls Church are counted here as a part of Fairfax County



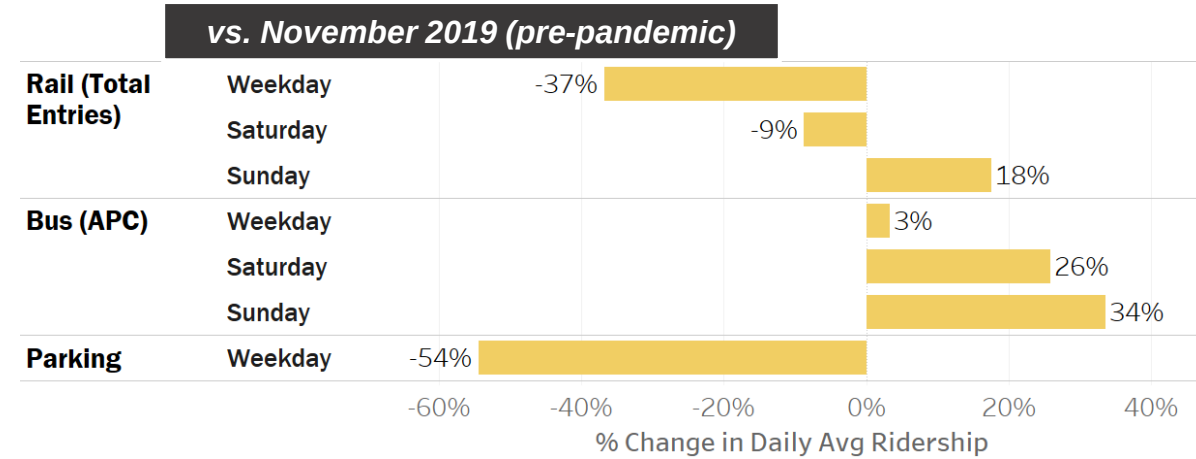
- Parking transactions grew the most at Deanwood on the Orange Line and Wheaton and Forest Glen stations on the Red Line.



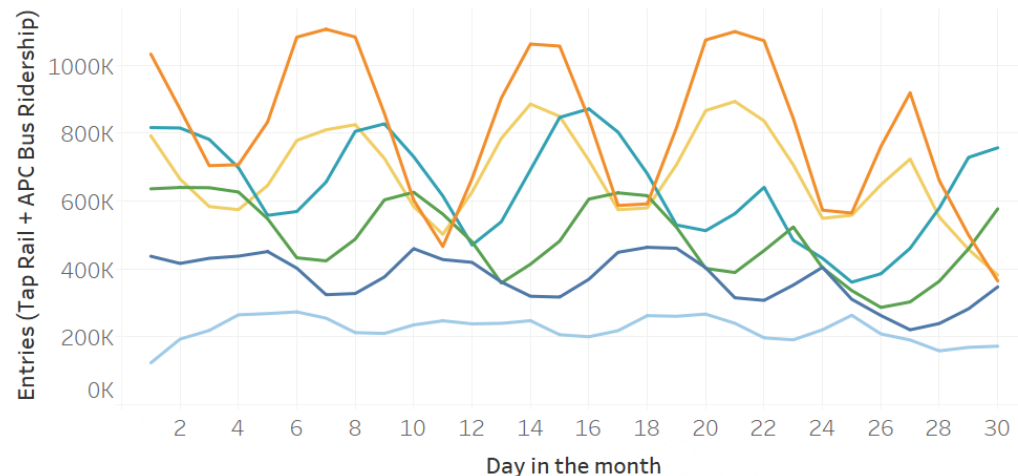
Pre-Pandemic Ridership Comparison

Current vs. pre-pandemic levels (November 2024 vs. November 2019):

- **Total** ridership was at 85% of pre-pandemic ridership overall, 79% of pre-pandemic levels on weekdays, 98% of pre-pandemic levels on Saturdays, and 25% *above* pre-pandemic levels on Sundays.
- **Rail** ridership was at 69% of pre-pandemic ridership overall, 63% of pre-pandemic levels on weekdays, 91% of pre-pandemic levels on Saturdays, and 18% *above* pre-pandemic levels on Sundays.
- **Bus** ridership was 9% *above* pre-pandemic ridership overall, at 3% *above* pre-pandemic levels on weekdays, 26% above pre-pandemic levels on Saturdays, and 34% above pre-pandemic levels on Sundays.
- **Parking** usage was at about 46% of pre-pandemic levels.
