

Review of Last Meeting


- The previous virtual community meeting was held on June 23, 2022
- The project team provided updates regarding recent construction, design and excavation activities. An update on the Art in Transit installation was also provided. Questions were answered from the community

Project Overview Recap

- Redevelopment of the site includes a new maintenance facility, parking for 300 buses and a parking structure for 560 employees
- The project will be constructed in three phases and is scheduled to be complete in the fourth quarter of 2026
- Phase I/Maintenance Facility July 2021 to August 2024
- Phase II/Employee Parking August 2024 to March 2026
- Phase III/Remaining Bus Parking March 2026 to December 2026

- Stationed waste receptacles & dumpsters
- Prevention of flying debris in inclement weather
- ✓ Installation of Department of Energy & Environment (DOEE)-approved water runoff controls
- ✓ Wheel washes for construction vehicles
- ✓ Weekly trash pick-up on project perimeter
- ✓ Onsite street sweeper for construction debris
- √ Typical weekday crew hours: 7 am 7 pm
- ✓ Limited hours for oversized load deliveries: 9:30 am 3 pm





- Continue pile caps & foundation

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Comprehensive Site Assessment



Comprehensive Site Assessment

- The DOEE recently approved the Comprehensive Site Assessment (CSA) plan to take soil samples for contaminant testing
- Samples have been collected
- Sample testing showed contaminants were below the CSA thresholds
- A report summarizing the results is being written and will be provided to the DOEE.
