

# Platform Improvement Project Summer 2022

## Project Overview

The Platform Improvement Project is a four-year program under Metro's capital improvement program dedicated to making platforms safer and more accessible for all customers. As part of the final phase of the project, five Orange Line stations, New Carrollton, Landover, Cheverly, Deanwood and Minnesota Ave, will close from Saturday, May 28 through Monday, September 5 for platform reconstruction and station modernization. Metro will also rehabilitate bridges on this section of the Orange Line during this time.

## C Station Closures

The following stations will be closed from **May 28 – Sept. 5, 2022:**

- **New Carrollton**
- **Landover**
- **Cheverly**
- **Deanwood**
- **Minnesota Ave**

Customers may experience weekend shutdowns, parking closures, pedestrian detours or bus stop relocations prior to and following the shutdown.

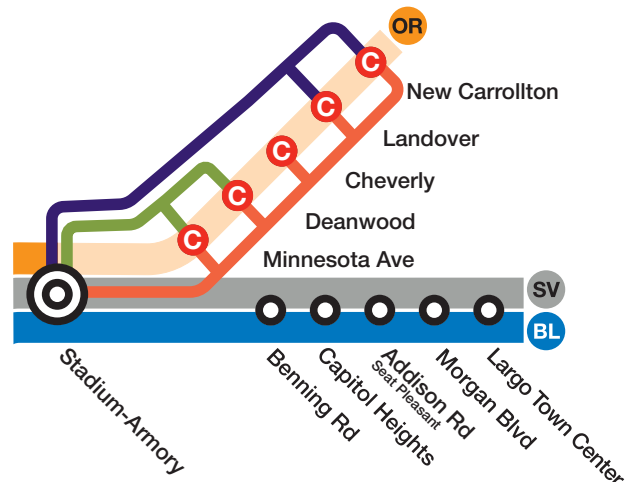
