

Overall Ridership in November

- Continuing impacts from COVID-19
- Rail
 - Ridership 87% lower than 2019 on weekdays
- Bus
 - Ridership 55% lower than 2019 on weekdays
 30% lower than 2019 on weekends
 - Fares waived, rear-door boarding
 - Note: This report shows preliminary bus APC data; online portal shows farebox data (operator-logged boardings only)
- Parking
 - Usage 93% lower than 2019

November 2020 Change in Ridership





Metrorail Ridership

- Ridership significantly lower than last year due to COVID-19
- Retention higher on eastern side of the region
- Differences between weekend and weekday much smaller
 - Pre-pandemic, Saturday was ~33% of a weekday (Sunday ~25%)
 - During the pandemic, these ratios have roughly doubled
- Notes:
 - Some reductions in frequencies, and hours of operation compared to 2019
 - Special events increased Saturday ridership on 11/7 and 11/14
 - South entrance to Huntington station closed due to escalator replacement






Metrobus Ridership

- Weekday ridership 55% lower than 2019 levels
- Stronger retention on weekends 70% of pre-COVID ridership retained on weekends

Notes:

- Bus service around 75% of pre-COVID levels. Some routes suspended.
- No fares charged; rear-door boarding continued. (Farebox data consists of operatorrecorded ridership only.)
- Data for several lines in Virginia not shown due to Cinder Bed Road work stoppage in November 2019. (7B,G,H,K,L,M; 18G,H,J,P; 29C,G,K,N,W; REX, S80,91)





Metro Parking Utilization

- Paid parking 93% lower than last year
- Moderately higher retention at Rhode Island Avenue, Fort Totten, Minnesota Avenue, Van Dorn St
