Air Filtration

New air filtration systems on buses, trains and in stations circulate fresh air from outside every three minutes.



Real-Time Crowding Information

Using their smartphones, riders can access crowdedness estimates of trains and buses from the WMATA website and participating apps.



Deep Cleaning

Using advanced hospital-grade cleaner, we're scrubbing down trains and buses every night.



Route Restoration

Restoration of certain routes, expansion of late-night service and more frequent buses along selected routes gives riders greater flexibility.
